

**E**very year, ministers of transport from around the world are joined by business leaders, top researchers, representatives from international organisations, business and trade associations and NGOs for three days of debate and exchange at the Annual Summit of the International Transport Forum in Leipzig, Germany. More than 1 100 delegates from some 70 countries, including more than 30 ministers, met on 21-23 May 2014, to examine the impact of global megatrends on transport under the heading "Transport for a Changing World". This brochure conveys the breadth of the event in images that I hope you will enjoy. Also available is a brochure summarising the substantive discussions.

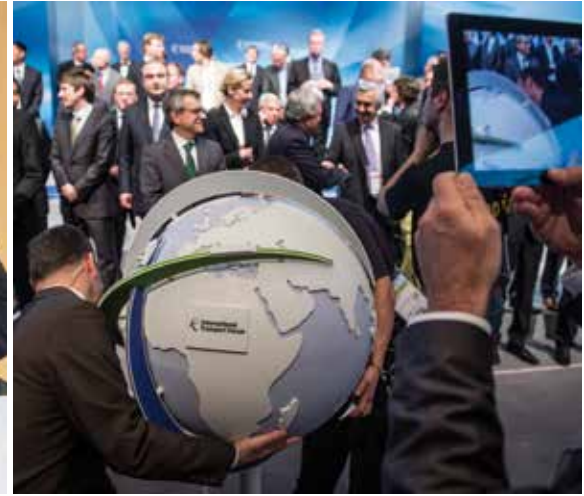
