Road Professional bus drivers and also transit through the territory of Slovakia are exempted from any measures and registration. For persons coming to Slovakia apply the rule to register before entering the Slovak territory. An obligation to register apply on persons over 12 years of age. Air

The ban for the civil flights departing from the territory of another state and landing in the territory of the Slovak Republic was lifted.

Entering the Slovak Republic by crew and passengers: All passengers disembarking, including transfer passengers, at the airport in the Slovak Republic must complete all mandatory data in the Public Health Passenger Locator Form before entering the country. Air carriers and other aircraft operators must keep the data for identification and contact details of passengers and seating plans available to them for flights into the airspace of the Slovak Republic for a minimum of 30 days.

- This does not apply to passengers arriving from Albania, Andorra, Armenia, Australia, Austria, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Canada, China, Chinese Taipei, Croatia, Cuba, Cyprus, Czechia, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Georgia, Germany, Greece, Hong Kong (SAR China), Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Japan, Jordan, Korea, Kosovo, Latvia, Lebanon, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Macao (SAR China), Malta, Mexico, Moldova, Monaco, Montenegro, Netherlands, New Zealand, North Macedonia, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, San Marino, Serbia, Singapore, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey, Ukraine or USA with a vaccination certificate showing that they were fully vaccinated at least 14 days before arrival.
